Good morning, dearest Community and Friends!

"...as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight." (Acts 1:9) This Thursday evening, we gather to celebrate the Feast of the Ascension of the Lord. The Ascension scene is not unlike that of a family gathering around the bedside of a dying loved one to say a final farewell. If our loved one is the least bit alert, we wait for some final message or gesture that we can carry in our memory to last us a lifetime. In those last hours or days, we often struggle with mixed feelings—we want him or her to be free and at peace, yet we cling to the life and love we have known in our earthly relationship. At that moment, our hearts often carry a mixture of sorrow and hope.

The disciples must have had similar feelings as they stood there, saying farewell to Jesus. His message was a hopeful one, assuring them that they would not be abandoned. He promised that the power of the Spirit would be with them so they could carry on his work. It was a loving message—he believed they were capable and ready to continue what he had begun. So with us. The love we have known in the life of someone who dies can be carried on in our life. It is this love that makes our difficult farwells endurable and our grief consolable.

We pray: Compassionate One, comfort those who are grieving. Give them a sense of hope like that given to the disciples. Let them know that their loved one can live on through our lives.

U.S. Church Foundations Shaking

Gallup poll results released March 25 showed that church attendance has generally been on the decline since 2009, when 42% of respondents said they had attended a service in the past week. After 2009, attendance rates have mostly been in the 30s, with only two exceptions: 40% attendance in 2012 and 29% attendance in 2021.

Post-pandemic church attendance rates declined more sharply among Catholics than it did among Protestants. The 2016-2019 average among Catholics was 37%, compared with a 2020-2023 average of only 30%. Protestants in the same time frame fell from 44% to 40%.

Church attendance was at its height in the mid- to late-1950s. The highest points were 49% in 1955 and 49% again in 1958.

The number of U.S. nuns and sisters has plummeted to fewer that 42,000 in 2022 representing a 76% decline since 1972. The average age of U.S. nuns is 80 with less than 1% under the age of 40.
